## **ABOUT USICH**

USICH was first authorized by Congress in 1987 when Congress passed the Stewart B. McKinney Homeless Assistance Act. The law recognized the complexity of coordinating Federal efforts to address homelessness, which is why Congress charged USICH to coordinate the Federal response to homelessness and create a national partnership with state and local governments, as well as the private sector, to reduce and end homelessness.

## **2026 President’s Budget**

The 2026 President’s Budget provides \$250,000 to conduct an orderly closeout of USICH, which includes sufficient funding for limited closeout activities and payroll liabilities.
