

# Measuring the Impact of Home, Together

*Home, Together,* the federal strategic plan to prevent and end homelessness released in July 2018, describes strategies that will be implemented between the 2018 and 2022 fiscal years. The plan also includes a public expression of multiple progress measures that we will use to assess the overall impact of its implementation.

Recently released reports have provided us with the data needed to establish the baseline measures from which we will assess progress. These assessments will be used to inform future revisions to the Plan and its Objectives and Strategies. In the interests of transparency and accountability, a summary of the measures is below.

It is important to note that the vast majority of the data presented here, based upon the timeframes covered, does not provide an assessment of the impact of the first year of *Home, Together* implementation. We have, however, provided an assessment of changes within these measures between the previous year's data and the most recent data available; for many, we have also assessed the changes since 2010, when the previous federal plan, *Opening Doors*, was first launched.

I'll be offering some reflections on this data, and the implications for the implementation of *Home, Together,* in future commentary.
